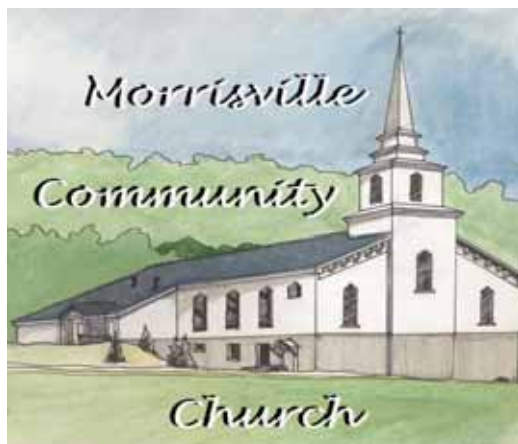

BAZAAR BUZZ

A reminder to all members and friends of the Morrisville Community Church that the Presbyterian Women's Biennial Bazaar will be held on Saturday, November 7, 2009 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. That is only one month away!

We need volunteers to work in the booths and to be cashiers. We also need volunteers to help clean up the Fellowship Hall, beginning at 2 p.m., on November 7th. If you can help in any way (even for just a couple of hours) please let Naydene or Robin know.

To help the chairpersons who are setting up the different booths, we are asking for two things:

1. that each person making a donation complete a PW Bazaar donation sheet for each booth. Forms will be available on "The Table" in the fellowship hall. It is often difficult for someone else to put a price on an item when that person does not know how much it cost to make the item. We want items to sell, but we do not want to under or over price items either. Your help would be deeply appreciated.
2. that all donations (except baked items) be at the church no later than Thursday, November 5th. This will give the booth chairpersons time to price items and set up the booths. Baked goods will be accepted at any time. If you are unable to bring your donations into the church, please call one of the chairpersons and we will arrange a time to pick them up.

Stewardship Campaign Fall 2009 THE CALL TO SUSTAIN

Being a faithful steward,

Then the Lord..said, "to your offspring I will give this land." So [Abraham] built there an alter to the Lord. ~ Genesis 12:7

The Lord promised land to Abram [Abraham]. Abram was so grateful for the generosity of God's promise, that he responds by building an altar to his generous Provider even before the promise becomes reality. In doing so, Abram demonstrates for us the impetus of solid stewardship.

Often, when we begin the stewardship season, we immediately jump to the budget and all kinds of financial studies and projections, hoping against hope that we will be able to balance the budget for the next year. These steps are definitely important and have their time and place in our fiscal cycles, but could we just once approach stewardship first from gratitude? That was Abram's response. That was Abram's stewardship.

Would you consider spending time during Stewardship season reflecting on all God has given you? If so, I think your life will be changed by the awareness. Perhaps, your response to God will come out of gratitude more so than a need to "balance the budget". Please reflect on all God means to you and then respond as generously as you can.
